

In the two Board meetings since I last wrote you, much has happened.

First, and foremost, we selected Northeast Security to patrol our properties beginning April 1, 1978. Northeast was selected because of their excellent reputation in such other areas as Brendonwood, Avalon Hills and Castleton, and their patrol style of high visibility. You will be receiving a set of decals with this issue of the Smoke Signal. We cannot urge you too strongly to put these on your cars. One of the keys to neighborhood security is to recognize "strangers". The decals will enable Northeast to do this. Also please carefully read Northeast's procedures which are included in this issue of the Smoke Signal.

Many plans have been approved for the maintenance and improvement of Association property as the weather improves.

- 1. New Lake signs are being designed by Nancy Knight and her Indian Lake Beautification Committee. They will replace the present white signs and be in natural wood saying simply "Indian Lake Community."
- 2. Tom Lyons is in the process of finalizing the plans for the North Beach. They include the annual clean-up day being Saturday, May 6th. All residents are urged to join this effort. The purchase of three new, indestructible (hopefully) grills and a concrete picnic table, a load of sand, a coat of paint on all piers and docks, and new rope and floats.
- 3. Bill Justice, in charge of the playground, has plans for new swing chains, no parking signs and a new basketball backboard and goal.
- 4. Bill Farrell is planning to repair the road to the South Beach and get some more sand.
- 5. Glenn Brown, Paul Butalla, Tom Lyons, John Miller and their 5 year planning committee are analyzing the work to be done between now and when the sewer project is complete. It is the hope of the Board and this committee that all the work that would involve the lake being emptied would be done in this time period and the lake could be kept full for at least five years. Work envisioned is a new concrete "silt trap" on the Indian Creek inlet, corrective work on the seals of the dam gate, corrections to the spillway apron, silt removal and removal of the mounds of dirt and east end island.



Indian Lake Residents:

We at Northeast Security Inc. are happy to announce that beginning April 1, 1978, we will begin a routine Security Patrol in the Indian Lake area. We at Northeast are currently providing similar services to the East Avalon Hills, Devonshire V, Town of Brendonwood, and many individuals in the Brendon Ridge, Brendon Shire, Brendon Forest, Brendon Park, Eagle Nest, Raven Rock and Lantern Hills areas.

The services we will be providing to Indian Lake are routine security patrols. During the weekdays (Monday-Thursday) we will be in the area a couple of times. On weekends, (Friday-Sunday) we will be in the area on a regular basis.

We at Northeast Security have five (5) marked patrol cars, equipped with our radio frequency as well as the Marion County Sheriff's Department frequency. We have a 24 hour a day dispatch.

All of our Road Officers are Marion County Special Deputies. Each is professionally trained, either through the Indiana Law Enforcement Academy or through a Sheriff's Academy.

In the near future each Indian Lake resident will be receiving from Northeast several different types of decals. You will receive round star decals used for identification purposes. You are to place one star on your mailbox and one on each automobile. You will also receive decals for your telephones giving all emergency numbers. You will also receive decals for the doors and windows of your home declaring your home to be protected by Electronic Burglar Alarm. Use these decals as a deterent to crime.

We at Northeast Security are looking forward to beginning our security patrols in the Indian Lake area. If you have any questions concerning any of the above information or a security problem, please do not hesitate to call us.

The Dam and Water Level

There have been alot ot questions asked about the dam and the water level of the lake. Bill Justice has been a very busy man lately because of the dam. He tells me the dam is not a float type, not automatic, and must be operated manually. The flood gates are noe operable and are used to protect the docks. The water level has varied anywhere from 5 -6 inches above the dam to 1-2 inches below. This variance is due to the spring rains and will continue until things start to dry out alittle. Also note that the opening of the gates is a demanding job and is mostly labor. Therefore it would be a full time operation for one man to work the mechanism to keep the water level consent,

Bill has been putting alot of his time into keeping the water at a normal level and at repairing the operating mechanism. There has been some trouble with it breaking lately. There are funds for the repair of the dam amounting to \$300. These funds are for major repairs, they do not enclude the

consent minor repairs.

The water level can be very fooling in different areas of the lake. If the water level is lower then 3-4 inches the east end of the lake is shallow, marshlike, encouraging the growth of mosquitos and undergrowth in the lake itself. It is than very hard to use the lake for boating and other activities. At the same time the West end of the lake notices very little change. With consent changes of the water level shore lines will erode, but this is normal.

We still have another problem at keeping the water level consent. Even after things start to dry out, we will lose water due to laekage in the dam. Which will not be repaired until the lake is drained in the fall.

There is alot to say about the dam and how it works, if anyone should want to know more about it, or would be interested in helping to keep it operating, please contact either Bill Justice or Paul Butalla.

Debries -- Trash is everywhere, and it will take alot of work to gather it up.


Floats - New float lines need to be put around the swimming areas. A couple of boats are needed to get this done.


mind, - I've got a good ear.
