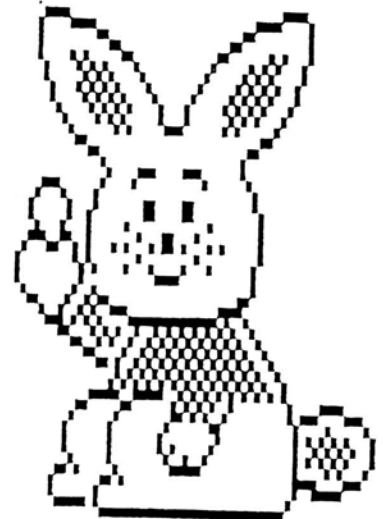
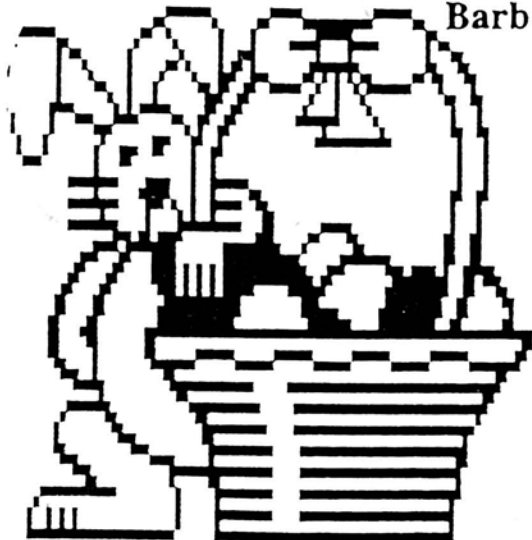


WE APPRECIATE YOU!

A crocus in the snow.

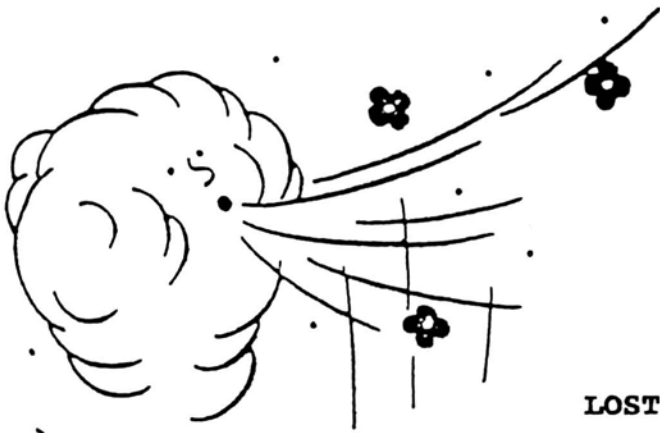
For gentle sleep which eases care
