Only watchful, caring neighbours with a healthy curiosity about strange cars, trucks, "delivery-men", and "workmen" can prevent such things from happening again and again.

BEACH GUARDS

Please remember to give your guests badges before they come down to the beach so that they won't have to go back after them. Beach guards have been asked to enforce the lake use regulation regarding guests.
