

As yet no closing date has been set for the sale of Park K.

Much discussion was held on the issue of rental property and such tenants use of lake facilities. The Board discussed with council Paragraph 7 of the ILIA by-laws which indicate the use of lake facilities are for property owners, their families and personal private guest only. The board is bound by this paragraph of the by-laws. The current by-laws cannot be changed without 100% approval of the members in good standing or by a 75% affirmative vote in the year 2000. A copy of this paragraph is to be mailed along with assessments.

Under new business, Mr. Ron Tucker discussed with the Board his intentions to build on lot 123 on South Drive. Mr. tucker's current plans will require a zoning variance. It was decided more research would need to be done on Paragraph 11 of the ILIA's certified copy of the resolution pertaining to the development standards. I would appreciate hearing from anyone who has a comment on this issue.

The following variance zoning case will be heard:

East 79th Street - to provide
for illuminated vinyl canopies.

The plans for this case are on file at the Mayor's office, Londay - Friday 9:30 - 4:00 p.m. Written comments can be submitted prior to the hearing date.


