In return for our sewer easement, Lawrence is proposing to do the following: construct a silt trap on the east end of the lake, restock the lake with fish, haul away any silt removed, certify that no damage will be done to the dam, and give us approximately \$4,000 in cash. The committee and attorneys of your Board are presently reviewing these proposals and will act on them at our May 21, 1978, meeting (or a special meeting if necessary).

We as an association are very fortunate to have our area at last served by sewers because so many of our members badly need them.

We regret to announce that Tim Hoover has resigned from our Board. Tim has contributed a great deal to our association. His replacement will be voted on at the next meeting.

The last month has seen much activity around the lake. Bill Justice (and Dave Upton) have got the basketball goal and swing sets repaired. Tom Lyons and Bill Farrell have made significant progress on the north and south beaches, respectively. Summer is just around the corner.

The next meeting of your Board will be held at 12:30 on May 21, 1978, at the French Indian Lake home. Again, everyone is welcome to these meetings.
