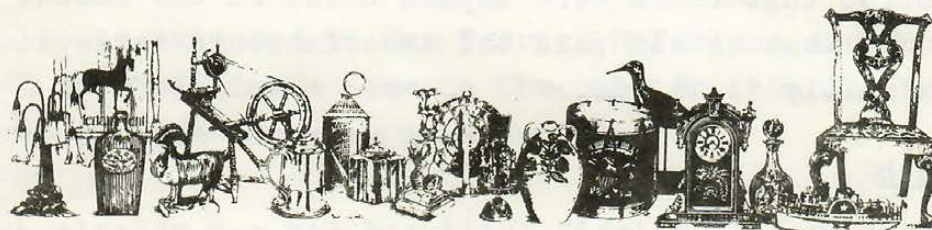

PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE

Dear Fellow Residents of Indian Lake,

The April meeting of the Indian Lake Board of Directors focused on preparations for an active summer season. Committee reports and special projects were discussed.

Treasurer's Report

Jack Sweeney presented the following information to the board in his treasurer's report.

Money Market Fund - A. G. Edwards - - - - -	\$ 49.39
Money Market Fund - Bank One - - - - -	4,921.14
Checking Account Balance - - - - -	<u>2,806.19</u>
	\$ 7,776.72

Jack reported that there were unpaid bills in the amount of \$197.73, and that he had paid the Association's taxes in the sum of approximately \$1,162.00.

North Beach

Joe Rohrman expressed his thanks to everyone who helped make the beach clean-up a success. Joe mentioned that a port-o-let will be in place in June, that new buoys would be purchased for the swimming area, and that the pipe protruding from the water in the North Beach area should be removed. Joe added that Chief Bob Jones, of the Lawrence Police Dept., will be the security officer for Indian Lake, and will be paid the same fee as last year.



Rob Parker suggested that the North Beach swimming platform is in need of repair.

John Taylor reported that he is looking into alternative companies to provide port-o-let and dumpster services.

Each year I am asked why the Board doesn't open the North Beach prior to May 1st. After much discussion regarding security, clean-up, safety, and expense, it was decided that the North Beach opening date will remain May 1st. Of course, people who walk to the beach

may use it all year long. When the beach is open to vehicles bringing food, drink, and groups of people, security and sanitation facilities must be in place.

South Beach



Rob Parker explained that the picnic tables at the South Beach had been stained, and that the South Beach gate had been repaired. A lighting wire is to be repaired, and trash barrels dumped. Rob wants to remind residents to re-lock the gate when leaving the South Beach. The illegal use of our beaches by non-residents is still a major problem.

Lake Conservation

John Miller has completed the project of draining the dredging pond. With the assistance of Dr. Bly, John has repaired one of the two gill nets. He has also pulled logs from the lake, cut them up, and burned them. There are still more logs to be removed from the lake. Anyone willing to lend a hand should contact John Miller . . . 823-4602.

Trespassers

There is an increasing problem with trespassers on Association property, and in particular, in the East End area. One suggestion is to put a new lock on the East End gate, distribute keys to Board members only, and prohibit Board members from handing out keys to non-Board members. After much discussion, this question was tabled until the June meeting.

I want to remind ALL residents of Indian Lake to contact the Lawrence Police Dept. immediately when trespassers are sighted.

Dam

Fred Lee is getting estimates for the installation of a fence, and for the repair of the electrical system at the dam.

Red Harris reported that the basketball rim had been broken. I have since replaced it. Red will be getting new chains for the swingset at the park.

Community Appearance

Fred Lee has called the City of Lawrence and requested them to lay down crushed stone in certain spots along the roadway running through Association property.

Dr. Bly has contacted Lawrence, and was successful in having them put up a "Dead End" sign along Indian Lake Blvd., S. Dr.

Vehicle Identification

Indian Lake residents must display stickers in the back left-hand windows of their vehicles to avoid being confronted as trespassers by the Lawrence Police. Please call Jack Sweeney if you need stickers . . . 823-4891.

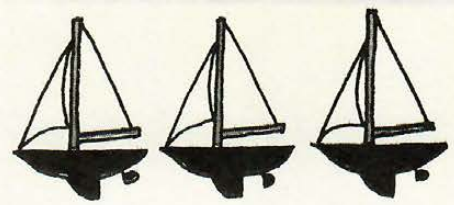
Lake Use and Water Safety Regulations

INDIAN LAKE IMPROVEMENT ASSOCIATION

LAKE USE AND WATER SAFETY REGULATIONS - 1985 - ADOPTED.

IDENTIFICATION OF MEMBERS

All lot owners and all members of their families who are using the lake or other Association property must have an Indian Lake decal placed in the rear window of their vehicle. If all members cooperate by using the decals, any intruders will be obvious immediately.

IDENTIFICATION OF GUESTS

Residents are allowed to invite guests to use the lake or other Association property.

1. A maximum of two guests are allowed per resident.
2. The resident must be present with the guests at all times.
3. Parties or picnics that consist of many guests must receive prior approval from the Board of Directors. You will need to plan your party far enough in advance to allow the Board to act upon your request at a regular monthly Board meeting.

IDENTIFICATION OF BOATS


No boats shall be permitted to operate unless legally owned by a lot owner.

1. The lot number must be prominently displayed on the side of the boat.
2. No more than two boats per lot are permitted.

BOATING REGULATIONS

The operator of every boat will, at all times, operate the craft in a careful and prudent manner, having due regard for the rights, safety, and property of other boats and persons.

1. Boats using motors shall not exceed ten miles per hour or create a noticable wake.

BOATING REGULATIONS (cont.)

2. Water skiing is not permitted.
3. Boats operating between sundown and sunrise must display a light which is clearly visible to other boats on the lake. This applies to all water craft - row boats, motor boats, canoes, kayaks, rubber rafts, pontoon boats, sailboats, and any other craft not listed.
4. Boats must be kept in good repair.
5. Residents may store their boats in the grass area, removed from the water, at the South Beach at their own risk, over the winter.

BEACH USE

The beaches are maintained by the Beach Committee and lake members. Please keep them clean by policing the area after use - picking up cans, papers, etc. and placing refuse in the containers provided.

1. For health and safety reasons, no animals will be permitted in the beach areas.
- * 2. No glass containers are allowed in the beach areas.
3. Vehicles present at the beaches must have the Indian Lake decal posted in the rear window.
4. Residents must be present with their guests at all times.
5. North Beach is closed to vehicular traffic from November 1st through April 30th. It's closed at night year-round.

SWIMMING REGULATIONS

You are your own lifeguard!

1. For your safety, observe all Red Cross Water Safety Rules.
2. Swim outside the roped area only when you are accompanied by a boat or floatation device.
3. Diving or swimming from the dam or levy is very dangerous and is not permitted.

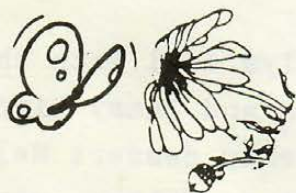

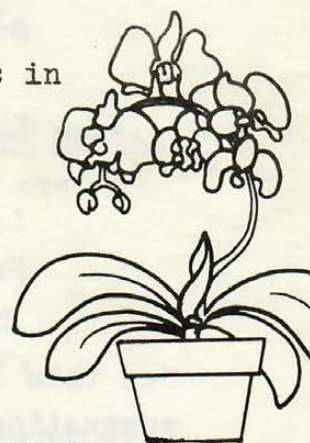
