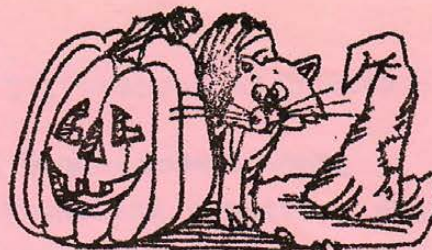

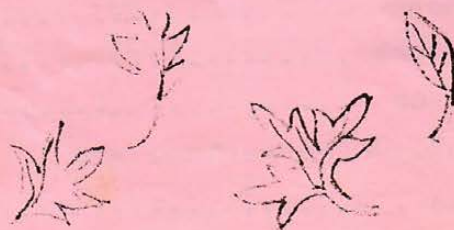
Fire wood is still available for cutting at the East End as a result of the tree removal that occurred during the dredging project.

Manned trucks will be available at Lawrence North High School, 7802 Hague Rd., for bagged leaf drop-off from 8 a.m. to 4 p.m. on Nov. 7, 14, 21, and 28, and Dec. 5 and 12.
