


Blast from the Past

The 1950 census records were released

by the U.S. National Archives on April 1, 2022. This is exciting news for genealogists and historians. The census records for our neighborhood are in Marion County enumeration district 49-36, sheets 6, 7, 8, 71, and 72.

The 1950 census is more than just a list of names, it shows family relationships, ages, birthplaces, and occupations. Unfortunately, house numbers weren't in use in our neighborhood at the time, and the dwelling serial numbers shown on the census aren't always in a logical order, so it's not easy to figure out who lived where. The image for sheet 7 includes the following known Indian Lake members:

Protect your Valuable Trees

This large cottonwood tree at South Beach suffered extensive beaver damage and is unlikely to survive.

Protect your valuable shoreline trees by wrapping them with cylindrical cages made of sturdy galvanized welded wire fencing with two-inch to four-inch mesh openings. Fencing should be at least three feet high. Encircle the trunk, leaving at least six inches between the tree and cage on all sides so the tree has room to grow and so that beavers cannot lean against or gnaw through the fencing. Large exposed roots that extend outside the cage may need to be protected too.

Further from shore, buck rubs are the main concern. All bucks will rub small trees of 1-3 inches in diameter. Four-inch or thicker trees are rubbed mostly by three-year or older bucks. Bucks especially like coniferous trees. Use wire mesh cylinders at antler height to protect your trees.



Radio Personalities of Indian Lake

At one time or another, our community has had close ties to a number of radio and TV personalities, including Bob and Tom, Dave "Gunner" Gunn, and Scott Hoke.

Syndicated radio hosts Bob Kevoian and Tom Griswold of the Bob & Tom Show have each lived at Indian Lake, but at different times. The Bob & Tom Show was established at radio station WFBQ in 1983, and syndicated nationally since 1995. In 2015, Bob and Tom were selected as inductees to the National Radio Hall of Fame. Bob retired in December 2015, but the show continues on.

Dave "Gunner" Gunn from WFBQ Q95 and iHeartMedia is one of the most well-known voices on the radio in Indiana. Gunner has occasionally joined the cast of the Bob & Tom Show and is also known for Stuck and Gunner in the Morning on WRZX X103. Although Dave has never lived at Indian Lake, he has close family ties here.

Scott Hoke grew up at Indian Lake and has had a long career in both radio and television. He's hosted the Indianapolis Symphony Orchestra's outdoor summer concert series, "Symphony on the Prairie" and is a 30-year voiceover veteran. Scott has also banked plenty of time in front of the camera. This year marks his 15th as host of the popular Mecum Collector Car Auctions on NBCSN and he's now on MotorTrend TV. Prior to that, he was on the Indiana Pacers broadcast team, and did nine years in the sports department at WRTV-6.
